

RAF grave, Sejerslev Churchyard, (Morsøe Parish). Weapon plane.

Grave with British weapon flyer, F/O. Frederick John Watson, DFM, of RAF No. 161 Squadron, Stirling LK312. Danish tombstone and stone with inscription.

During a mission with weapons to a resistance dropping place in District I, Vendsyssel, a RAF plane crashed into the Limfjord close to Livoe at night before 5 March 1945. The whole crew was killed.

F/O. Watson was found 22 May 1945 on the north side of the Iceland of Mors outside Feggeore. At 26 May he was buried at Sejerslev churchyard. The local vicar committed the funeral.

Two other crewmembers from the plane are buried at Fjerritslev (Wing Commander M.A. Brogan), and at Loegstoer the last four are buried.

During the same night Squadron No. 138 lost a Stirling weapon plane. It crashed into Ringkoebing Fjord west of low watered Tipperne. Here the crew survived.
