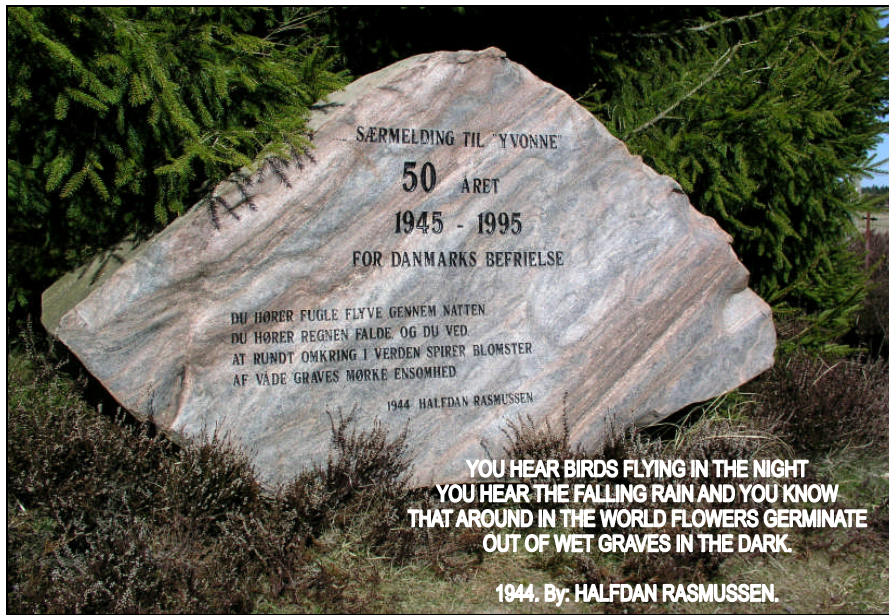


Memorial at dropping place 'YVONNE'.



Memorial stone at dropping place for weapons situated out in Groest Heather north of Roerbaek Lake. This spot had the code name 'YVONNE'. Veterans from the local Resistance group raised the memorial in April 1995.



Groest Heather in the middle of Jutland north of Roerbaek Lake. This remote place was used by The Resistance Movement as a 'dropping place', when aeroplanes from Royal Air Force dropped containers with weapons and sabotage materials to the resistance groups waiting in the dark. But first the local leader had heard the message from Special Operations Executive (SOE) in London on the broadcasting BBC Radio earlier in the evening. After the news the special message 'greetings to' – followed by several code names, and some times 'greeting to 'YVONNE'. It was the signal for dropping at Groest Heather. The leader of the group at North Snede gathered his men. They went out to the dropping place, where they waited for the coming RAF plane. After a successful 'drop', the men quickly picked up the containers, got rid of the chutes and transported the goods, maybe to a barn at a farm. Here the containers were unpacked. Ammunition, weapons and explosives now secretly could be transported to sabotage groups somewhere in Jutland.
