Bentz Peak northwest of Krestova, to remember RCAF Pilot Officer Wilbur Boyd Bentz of Nelson, killed in action May 13, 1944 over Belgium.

Button Peak on the Brooks Peninsula, Vancouver Island, to remember Canadian Army Lance Corporal Frederick Button of Victoria, killed in action August 15, 1944 near Falaise, France.

Dickinson Lake north of Monashee Park, to remember RCAF Flying Officer Robert Harry Dickinson of Vancouver, killed in action June 29, 1944 over France.

Dungate Lakes east of Mabel Lake, to remember RCAF Flying Officer Alfred William Dungate of Vernon, killed in action October 25, 1943 over the Azores Islands.

Mount Hailstone west of Vernon, to remember RCAF Flying Officer Terence R. Hailstone of West Vancouver, killed February 11, 1945.

Hall Creek northwest of Slocan, to remember Canadian Army Private Raymond E. Hall of Slocan, killed in action May 23, 1944 in the Liri Valley, Italy.

Hosford Island north of Port Hardy, to remember RCAF Sergeant Horatio Charles Hamilton Hosford of Vancouver, killed July 22, 1942.

Mount Janicki west of Vernon, to remember Canadian Army Sergeant David Janicki of Vernon, killed in action February 9, 1945 near the Belgium-German border.

Mount Kurtzhals on Lasqueti Island, to remember RCAF Pilot Officer Alan E. Kurtzhals of Lasqueti Island, killed in action December 18, 1944 over Belgium.

Lees Lake north of Monashee Park, to remember RCAF Flying Officer John Clive Lees of Rossland, killed in action September 19, 1944 over England.

Lieutenant Ian Philip MacDonald Picnic Area in Rosewall Creek Park, to remember Canadian Army Lieutenant Ian Philip MacDonald of Fanny Bay, killed in action June 10, 1944.

Riley Lake north of Monashee Park, to remember RCAF Flying Officer Virgil Lee Riley of Castlegar, killed in action October 15, 1944 over Denmark.

Simpson Lake north of Pine Pass, to remember RCAF Pilot Officer David Albert Simpson of West Vancouver, killed in action November 8, 1941 over the North Sea.

Srigley Cove in Laredo Inlet, to remember RCAF Flying Officer Joseph Ralph Gordon Srigley of Vancouver, killed in action August 17, 1944 over Denmark.

Vandenbergh Lake on Pitt Island, to remember RCAF Pilot Officer John W. Vandenbergh of West Vancouver, killed in action January 5, 1945.
