Left Oakington at 1200 hrs. with 2 other aircraft on a daylight sortie. Bursts were observed on slipways and across harbour. Stirling N6013 last seen at 1511 hrs. circling dinghy with crew of unknown aircraft and then attacked by two fighters. Flg. Off. D.T. Witt DFM had his aircraft N6005 attacked 4 times in succession by Bf 109 F which was finally shot down by rear gunner Plt. Off. J.L.A. Mills. Stirling N3655 attacked by fighter and hit by flak but returned to base with N6005.			Flg.Off. Kinnane, R.A.A.F, the pilot of Stirling I, N6013 buried on 11 July in the Fourfeldt Cemetery at Esbjerg together with unknown airman picked up on 6 July 50-60 nautical miles W of Esbjerg by fishing boat E 67 "Laila" and carried to Esbjerg.
