Casualty Enquiry D.122

Reference is made to our Casualty Report of even reference dated 2nd December, 1946.

2. Reference paragraph 6 of the report, it is requested that it be amended to read:-

"Quote" The body was dressed in Battle Dress Blouse, Service Dress trousers, blue polo neck pullover, issue woollen vest, long woollen issue underpants. One silk flying glove. Civilian braces, R.C.A.F. shoulder flashes were found on battle dress blouse, as well as F/Sgt.'s crown and stripes. As the only other Canadian of this crew if R130273 F/Sgt. Masson, E.S. it is suggested that this grave be accepted as his "Unquote".

3. Furthermore, regarding Grave No. 48 (Paragraph 7) Danish Police reports state that on the right arm were three stripes and a crown, and above the left breast pocket were R.A.F. pilots wings.
